Financial Summary for June 2015 and Fiscal Year End (FYE)2015:

- For FY15, Giving was 0.9% higher than budget.
- For FY15, Early Learning Center income was under budget by 9.4% which was the forecasted amount in January of 2015.
- FY 15 **Spending** was controlled at 95% of the budget.
- While **Operational Cash Flow** for FY15 was a positive \$8,837, there was a write off to the Cash Reserve account of \$12,840 due to beginning FY15 with a deficit. Please contact Susan Mello, our Business Manager, for a detailed review of the Operational Cash Flow analysis.
