# Worshiping

I wonder if Charlie Brown ever received a Valentine? If you are a fan of the comic strip Peanuts you will recall that every Valentine's Day Charlie Brown would make the trek to the mailbox only to find it full of cobwebs, not one Valentine for Charlie. Snoopy, his dog, on the other hand couldn't carry all of his as he danced back to his doghouse obviously feeling the love.

I am not sure what Charles Schultz, the creator of Peanuts, was trying to express through the utter disappointment of Charlie Brown. Was he remembering his own childhood and the pain of not being very well liked? Was he trying to show to the world how a small gesture could make a big difference on another person and the lack of that gesture could be equally damaging? Perhaps he was just developing Charlie Brown as a lonely kid growing up with a dog that was more popular than he was? Lots of questions, but no answers. Just like when I would read the annual Valentine's Day strip from Schultz, even though I knew that Charlie Brown would not receive any Valentines I was always rooting for him in my heart. I would think maybe this year he would receive at least one Valentine...and wouldn't it be great if it were from the little red headed girl! I wanted that for Charlie Brown. I wanted him to know that he was lovable and he was important. Alas, I don't recall him ever receiving a single card.

Funny how a comic strip can stir up such deep emotions, maybe that was what Charles Schultz was going for. Maybe he wanted us to feel the pain of the lonely and hurting people around us. Perhaps he wanted to motivate us to action and reach out to someone we know. Maybe, just maybe that is my point in this article.

Valentine's Day for some is a day to express their love to one or more people. For some it is a painful reminder that they are alone and perhaps they even feel unloved.

The truth is all of us are deeply loved, even if we don't know it. Consider what Jesus' disciple John wrote; "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!" (John 3:1) God has a deep love for each of us, a love deep enough to send his Son to us. Now that we have been loved then John says; "For this is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another." (John 3:11) "Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth." (John 3:18)

Do you know of a person who could be lonely? Do you know someone who lost his or her spouse this past year? I wonder how they would feel if they opened up their mailbox to find a Valentine from you.

## **Small Group Bible Studies**

**Adult Forum** - Led by Pastor Harold Teuscher

During **February**, the Pastor's Forum will continue exploring the meaning of the Sunday morning lessons (Old Testament, Epistle & Gospel) for the 1<sup>st</sup> half of the Epiphany season of the Church Year. Each Sunday we will review the appointed lessons, discover their unifying theme, and apply God's Word to our everyday lives. For example: What's the big attraction about Epiphany? What's the role of the Wise Men in the Christmas story? Why are we *always* in jeopardy . . . but **never** in jeopardy? We will identify ways in which Jesus shines through us to provide light to those living in darkness?

Join us every **Sunday 8:45 – 9:45 am** in the Fellowship Hall. You are welcome to participate in the discussions, or simply listen & learn from the presentations and the comments of the class participants. Pastor & Julie Teuscher prepare a handout that introduces & summarizes the Biblical material and its meaning for our lives today.

**Sunday morning adult Bible studies** – Led by Barry Ritchie

As one of your New Year's resolutions, why not deepen your understanding of Scripture and join others who are also interested in digging deeper into the Bible? Starting **January 15<sup>th</sup>**, two new adult Bible studies (detailed below) will be meeting each Sunday morning. These classes will help you better apply the teachings of the New Testament to your life, work, and relationships. Using the *Life Application Bible Study Series method*, each of these 13-week classes will lead us through an important part of the New Testament. The study guide includes our weekly lessons, the entire text of the Bible book(s) we'll study, as well as that book's *Life Application Bible Commentary* (including illuminating notes, application hints, maps, tables, personal sketches, and more). **At 8:50 AM: The Epistles of John.** Written to a group of small house churches by the last living apostle, these letters from John encouraged Christians to live as Jesus had taught. These short letters provide the inspired wisdom needed to live as members of God's family and fellowship, and also contain important warnings about how to avoid failure in our relationships with Jesus and our Christian community. This study will lead us through each of these three letters to know better what God expects of us, to deepen our faith in Christ, and to strengthen our community of faith here at Risen Savior Lutheran Church.

**At 10:10 AM: The Acts of the Apostles.** The Acts of the Apostles ("Acts") provides the only detailed history found in the Bible of the early years of the church. Covering the first three decades after Jesus ascended to heaven, Acts provides an incredible panorama of life in the 1<sup>st</sup> century as Peter, Paul, and the first Christians spread the Good News about Christ throughout the Roman Empire. We will read about the events that sent this message from Jerusalem to "the ends of the earth", compelling the first Christians to sacrifice everything for that faith. This class will lead us through the entire book of Acts to help us better understand our faith and our history, and to inspire us to greater devotion to Jesus and His church.




## Women's Ministries



2017 marks the **75<sup>th</sup> anniversary** of the founding of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. The Lord has blessed the work of the League through the giving of MITES (offerings) which are used throughout the world as Mission Grants. \$100,000 was given from 2015-2016 for a LCMS Global Seminary Initiative. This grant enables international students to study at one of the LCMS seminaries in order for them to return to be leaders in their churches.

Our Bible study, "Steadfast in the Faith", has begun taking a closer look at the First, Second and Third Articles in the Catechism and how it applies to our life today. We re-discovered how much God the Father Almighty loves us and takes care of us.

## Concert Supporting Shepherd's Canyon Retreat

### Gospel Singers and Plane Crash Survivors to appear together in Concert

Dave and Barb, Roger Walck and Don Wharton will appear in concert at Risen Savior Lutheran Church at **3:00pm** on **Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup>**. The concert will be their first appearance together for many years.

On August 13<sup>th</sup>, 1993, while returning to Alaska from an evangelistic and humanitarian mission in the Russian Far East, Dave, Barb, Don and four others survived a plane crash in the Bering Sea. They are the only survivors of a plane crash in the Bering Sea or the Arctic Ocean. Their helicopter rescue has been described as the most dramatic air/sea rescue in aviation history. This dramatic story has been heard on *Focus on the Family* and on dozens of appearances on radio and television programs in America and Australia. Dave and Don's books and DVDs about this story will be available at the concert.

In addition to a great deal of music, the concert will feature Dave, Barb and Don sharing highlights from this dramatic story.



### Financial Summary for December 2016 and FYTD17:

- Risen Savior continues to be blessed by the generosity of its congregants. After the Pathway mortgage was paid off, donations continued. A payment of \$37,000 was made on the primary mortgage in January.
- Giving Results
  - Giving continues to be strong.
  - Giving was over budget in December by \$14,221 and FYTD by \$46,831.
- Spending
  - Spending was *under* budget in December by \$20,325.
    - FYTD17, expenses are *under* budget by \$71,210.
    - We are currently expecting to be at or slightly under budget on expenses by FYE17.
- Early Learning Center (ELC)
  - The ELC Income was over budget by \$9,173.
- Net Operating Cash is (130) which is a planned amount based on budget. Operating Cash increased in December by \$50,081.


