

Worshiping

Orientation – Disorientation - Reorientation

For as far back as I can remember, whenever I was feeling the pressure of life, I have turned to the Psalms. There is something so raw about the emotions that are expressed in those ancient hymns. Recently, I was introduced to a pattern in some of the Psalms – Orientation, Disorientation, and then Reorientation.

If we take a look at Psalm 142, David begins with David having the right orientation.

“I cry aloud to the Lord;
I lift up my voice to the Lord for mercy.

I pour out before him my complaint;
before him I tell my trouble.

When my spirit grows faint within me,
it is you who watch over my way”

When he is in trouble, he knows who to turn to, the Lord. This is where you and I would start out. Something happens in life that brings us down and we go to the Lord. We lift up a prayer asking for his help. We have the right orientation.

Then when we don't find any relief, when the problem isn't solved, and our health isn't restored, the relationship falls further apart. Well, now we are thrown for a loop. I thought God answers prayers? I thought he was waiting to lend a hand and make things better, now what? We become disoriented and start looking to our own ability or to those around us, desperately trying to make sense out of life. David wrote Psalm 142 while he was hiding in a cave from King Saul who was trying to kill him. Kill him? Wait - the prophet said that David would be king, so he cannot die. What is going on? Disorientation.

“Look and see, there is no one at my right hand;
no one is concerned for me.

I have no refuge;
no one cares for my life.”

David has nowhere to turn and he feels all alone; “no one cares for my life.” Oh, how many times have you felt like it was you against the world? You were in this all alone; no one really cares what is happening in your life.

Although it's only one verse later that David changes his tone, you can be sure it was not that quick. Who knows how long he lingered in a state of disorientation, but at some point he becomes reoriented.

“I cry to you, Lord;
I say, “You are my refuge,
my portion in the land of the living.”

David remembers that the Lord is his refuge. He does care for David even when it doesn't feel like he does. David is reoriented and put back in line putting his trust in his God. The same will happen for us. No, it doesn't happen in a matter of moments and sometimes not even in a matter of days. Yet, the promises of God are still true and real. He will never leave us or forsake us. He is our refuge and strength and in time we get reoriented and once again see God for the loving father that He is.

Maybe this is why whenever I run into a rough spot I turn to the Psalms. They can express my frustration, fear and even anger. Yet, they always bring me back to my refuge, my strength, and my fortress – my God. I pray they do the same for you.



Small Group Bible Studies

Adult Forum - Led by Pastor Harold Teuscher

The class on "Peter & Paul" continues throughout **JULY**. These two key pillars of Early Christianity and Western Civilization were extremely important in the development of Christianity. The epic TV miniseries brings to life the precarious existence of the early church. We will follow along as we read our Bibles and see the importance of the many events portrayed by the book of Acts. Please join us at **8:40am each Sunday** as we see the hand of God in the spread of His Gospel.

The video will help us see the violent opposition from without and the constant turmoil from within the church. These two key leaders emerge as they struggle to keep the faith alive and spread the news not only to the Jewish church but also include the Gentiles in God's Good News of salvation. This dramatic video will follow these leaders for three decades. Included is the stoning of Stephen (first martyr of the church), Paul's vision of the risen Christ on the road to Damascus, the encounter of the first Ecumenical Council in Jerusalem, Paul's missionary journeys, clashes over Jewish law, and Peter's decision to follow Paul's courageous footsteps. It ends with the beheading of Paul and Peter's crucifixion under the persecution of Emperor Nero in 64 a.d. We will supplement the video with material from the writings of Paul Maier and other authors.

All nominations were required to be submitted by Feb. 9, 2016, or five months prior to the start of the Synod convention, when the ballots, received by an outside auditor, were tallied and delivered to the Secretary of the Synod.

Financial Summary for May 2016:

- For May, Giving was above budget by \$8,210.
 - The three month trend of giving over budget has brought the FYTD16 giving over budget by \$9,105.
- ELC income exceeded budget by \$1,126 and is projected to meet budget for the end of the fiscal year.
- All other income was over budget by \$625 in May.
- Operational Expenses for May were at 102.1% of budget. FYTD16 expenses are 97.2% of budget. We can expect June 2016 expenses to be over budget for the month due to fiscal year end spending. FY16 total spending is forecasted to be under budget for the year.
- Net Operating Cash increased by \$27,801. This increase in Operating Cash is budgeted and planned to provide for the summer months when giving and ELC income is lower.
