# Worshiping

Bundle up everyone, we are in the dead of winter. Okay, I had to stop typing for a minute because I was laughing so hard my fingers couldn't work the keys. Seriously, January is our coldest month according the National Climatic Data Center. It is true that each year that I live in the valley the more acclimated I get to the climate. Back in Iowa if 46 was the high in January I was putting on a light jacket. Now when it dips into the 50's I am reaching for a warm jacket.

People told me that I would get acclimated to the weather when I first moved here and I am not sure I believed them. In my mind anytime you were above freezing from November – March it was balmy and no need for much of a coat. In the same way I thought if it was above 100 in the summer I would just hunker down inside with the AC blasting. Now my perspective has changed. If I see 100 on the thermometer in the summer I think; "Oh, good it's not too hot I can get some yard work done!" When I leave for the office in December and it is 42 I am considering putting on a sweater for the day.

In the same way we get acclimated to certain behaviors. What at one time we would never think of doing now comes quite naturally to us. When I was a kid I never thought about making my bed. That is until my mother would tell me to go make my bed. Eventually it finally sunk in and one of the first things I do every morning is make my bed.

Then there are behaviors that we wish we didn't do. They come quite naturally to us because we have been doing them for so long. The first thing we reach for in the morning is the pack of cigarettes, even though we know what it is doing to our lungs. When a driver pulls in front of us on the freeway the expletives flow rather naturally, even though the grandchildren are in the back seat.

We would like to change our behavior, but it is deeply ingrained in us. Perhaps the problem is we are relying too much on our own power and not giving ourselves enough time to get acclimated to the new behavior.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ..." (II Corinthians 5:17-18)

Start relying on God and His power. Change the behavior, realize there will be setbacks, but don't give up. Give yourself enough time to acclimate to your new reality. Pretty soon you can look back and see what God has done in your life.

Now if you will pardon me I am going to put on a sweater, Brrr.

## **Small Group Bible Studies**

**Adult Forum** - Led by Pastor Harold Teuscher

During **January**, the Pastor's Forum will explore the meaning of the Sunday morning lessons (Old Testament, Epistle & Gospel) for the 1<sup>st</sup> half of the Epiphany season of the Church Year. Each Sunday we will review the appointed lessons, discover their unifying theme, and apply God's Word to our everyday lives. For example: What's the big attraction about Epiphany? What's the role of the Wise Men in the Christmas story? Why are we *always* in jeopardy . . . but **never** in jeopardy? We will identify ways in which Jesus shines through us to provide light to those living in darkness?

Join us every **Sunday 8:45 – 9:45 am** in the Fellowship Hall. You are welcome to participate in the discussions, or simply listen & learn from the presentations and the comments of the class participants. Pastor & Julie Teuscher prepare a handout that introduces & summarizes the Biblical material & its meaning for our lives today.

#### Sunday morning adult Bible studies - Led by Barry Ritchie

As one of your New Year's resolutions, why not deepen your understanding of Scripture and join others who are also interested in digging deeper into the Bible? Starting January 15<sup>th</sup>, two new adult Bible studies (detailed below) will be meeting each Sunday morning. These classes will help you better apply the teachings of the New Testament to your life, work, and relationships. Using the *Life Application Bible Study Series method*, each of these 13-week classes will lead us through an important part of the New Testament. The study guide includes our weekly lessons, the entire text of the Bible book(s) we'll study, as well as that book's *Life Application Bible Commentary* (including illuminating notes, application hints, maps, tables, personal sketches, and more). At 8:50 AM: The Epistles of John. Written to a group of small house churches by the last living apostle, these letters from John encouraged Christians to live as Jesus had taught. These short letters provide the inspired wisdom needed to live as members of God's family and fellowship, and also contain important warnings about how to avoid failure in our relationships with Jesus and our Christian community. This study will lead us through each of these three letters to know better what God expects of us, to deepen our faith in Christ, and to strengthen our community of faith here at Risen Savior Lutheran Church.

At 10:10 AM: The Acts of the Apostles. The Acts of the Apostles ("Acts") provides the only detailed history found in the Bible of the early years of the church. Covering the first three decades after Jesus ascended to heaven, Acts provides an incredible panorama of life in the 1<sup>st</sup> century as Peter, Paul, and the first Christians spread the Good News about Christ throughout the Roman Empire. We will read about the events that sent this message from Jerusalem to "the ends of the earth", compelling the first Christians to sacrifice everything for that faith. This class will lead us through the entire book of Acts to help us better understand our faith and our history, and to inspire us to greater devotion to Jesus and His church.

## **Calling All Solos**


