#### **New Start**

First of all, what's with the bonnet on his head? Those went out decades ago. No parent is going to put a bonnet on their newborn baby. A little baseball cap, sure. A knit hat with the logo of their favorite sports team-you bet. A bonnet? Not a chance.

## NEW ADULT BIBLE CLASSES BEGIN JANUARY 14, 2018!

As one of your New Year's resolutions, why not deepen your understanding of Scripture and join others who are also interested in digging deeper into the Bible? Starting **January 14<sup>th</sup>**, two new adult Bible studies (detailed below) will be meeting **each Sunday** morning.

Led by Barry Ritchie, these classes will help you better apply the teachings of the New Testament to your life, work, and relationships. Using the *Life Application Bible Study Series method*, each of these 13-week classes will lead us through an important part of the New Testament. Copies of the study guide for each class will be available for purchase (\$6.00). The study guide includes our weekly lessons, the entire text of the Bible book (s) we'll study, as well as that book's *Life Application Bible Commentary* (including illuminating notes, application hints, maps, tables, personal sketches, and more). As previous attendees will tell you, you will find these classes fascinating, enjoyable, and enriching. We'll meet **Sunday mornings in the Conference Room**.



**8:50 am: The Acts of the Apostles.** The Acts of the Apostles ("Acts") provides the only detailed history of the early years of the church found in the Bible. Covering the thirty years after Jesus ascended to heaven, Acts provides an incredible look at life in the 1<sup>st</sup> century as Peter, Paul, and the first Christians spread the Good News about Christ throughout the Roman Empire. We will read about the events that sent this message from Jerusalem to "the ends of the earth", a message that compelled the first Christians to sacrifice everything for that faith... and compels us to act, as well. This class will lead us through the entire book of Acts to help us better understand *our* faith and *our* history, and to inspire us to greater devotion to Jesus and His church.

**10:10 am:** *The Letters of Peter.* Besieged on all sides, the early disciples faced threats from the Roman Empire and from those who would twist the story of Christ into a pagan form. Followers of Christ could easily have been defeated or diverted. A distinct minority in a pagan society, they could have capitulated to their culture. But, challenged by God through these holy writers and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, they stood fast, even unto death. In a time when the surrounding culture presses the church for compromise, these letters will inspire and challenge us to be bold in our proclamation.

# Sunday Volunteer Sign-up Process

Last month was the first meeting with the Design Unfocus Groups (DUGs) and architect Kevin Callahan. The four DUGS are:

#### Financial Summary for November 2017:

- Giving Results
  - For November, Giving *missed* budget by (\$757) and is *over* budget \$29,771 for FYTD18.
- Spending
  - Spending was under budget in November by (\$15,487) and under budget (\$34,165)
     FYTD18.
- Early Learning Center (ELC)
  - ELC Net Income was **over** budget by \$4,968 for the month of November 2017. For FYTD18, the ELC net income is **over** budget \$13,399.
- Net Operating Cash is \$14,540 which is a positive increase of \$15,416 from October 2017. As a reminder, we begin the fiscal year with a Net Operating Cash of zero. We expect Net Operating Cash to be negative until December or January. This year, Risen Savior has been blessed to have a positive Operating Cash at the end of November. As a comparison to last fiscal year, Net Operating Cash for November 2016 was (\$50,211).
