Operation Christmas Child

This year Operation Christmas Child began its 4th Annual Kick-Off Campaign las month. OCC is an extension program of Samaritan's Purse of which Franklin Graham, son of Billy Graham, is president. OCC has touched the lives of over 140 million children around the world since 1993. This ministry is often referred to as "The Shoebox Ministry". Shoe boxes are filled to



capacity with all sorts of items for children ages 2-14. Last year alone, 11.5 million boxes went to children in over 100 countries. Along with the shoebox is an opportunity for children to become Christians and study the Gospel using the program called "The Greatest Journey". You can be a part of this ministry. Boxes are filled by you and delivered to the church on designated Sundays. These boxes are then placed in large packing boxes, trucked to distribution centers and then flown or shipped to 130 different countries. A check made out to Samaritan's Purse or cash for \$9.00 is requested to help defray the costs of shipping. If you choose not to pack a box, you can still make a donation. This can be in cash or check. All donations go to Samaritan's Purse. There will be an envelope at the display table in the narthex each Sunday from **now to November 12th.** Boxes can also be picked up on those dates at the display table. Last year we met our goal of 500 boxes. This year we're shooting for 600! I know this congregation can meet the challenge. **All boxes are due back by Sunday, November 12th.**

Risen Savior's Pathway Center will also be acting as a relay center for the Southeast Valley where other churches will be bringing their boxes to us for transport to another destination for loading into a truck. This will happen during the week of **November 13th through the 20th.**

Financial Summary for September 2017:

 - For September, Giving exceeded budget by \$6,354 and is over budget \$28,997 for FYTD18.
- Spending
 - Spending was under budget in September by \$15,991 and under budget \$34,771
 FYTD18.
- Early Learning Center (ELC)
 - ELC Net Income was over budget by \$4,932 for the month of September 2017.
 For FYTD18, the ELC net income is over budget \$7,718.
